
Antique Auto Show

Movie Review (by Tim Tilson)

This was a very unique movie and of interest to all. While not Catholic per se, it does involve one of the oldest Catholic devotionals, the pilgrimage on the Camino de Santiago (or the Way of St James). This pilgrimage route is over 1,000 years old and normally starts on the French side of the Pyrenees. It continues for 500 miles across northern Spain to the cathederal in Santiago de Campostela and the grave of St James.

The plot of the movie involves a young man (Emilio Estevez) who dies on the first day of the start of his pilgrimage. His father (Martin Sheen) comes to France to claim the body and then decides on the spur of the moment to continue the pilgrimage in his son's name. The movie revolves around his adventures along the way and the characters he meets.

The movie is not overtly Catholic. However it does highlight sights and places of the Pilgrim's route because it was filmed on location. And like all "road pictures" the characters grow and change along the way. I highly recommend it.

This is heaven. All are loved. All are brothers. Go back and let them in!"


St. Peter goes back to the Gates, looks around, and lets out a heavy sigh. He returns to God's chambers and says "Well, they're gone."
